## Eparchial Fundraising Campaign Raises \$175,553.00 to Date for the New Musée Ukraina Museum Building

Musée Ukraina Museum takes great pleasure in announcing that \$175,533.00 has been raised to date since the Eparchial Campaign began on October 14, 2007 at the Eparchial Convention in Yorkton. At that time we set a goal of gathering \$1M through donations from parishioners throughout the Eparchy. The target amount of \$1M remains and we have two years left in the campaign to attain our financial objective.

The generous response through donations and pledges from many of the faithful members of our Eparchy shows the dedication of our people in creating a place that preserves and celebrates our heritage. "We are very pleased with the generosity of the many individuals, families and clergy towards this valuable project" noted President, Patricia Mialkowsky. "We are especially indebted and truly grateful to all the Clergy who support and continue the fundraising, by not only helping to organize the Campaign in their own parishes, but by encouraging their parishioners to be generous and to set an example through their own benevolent financial contributions." We are also inspired by the amount of new donors who have stepped forward to support this project".


#### Parishioners of St. George's Ukrainian Catholic Church in Prince Albert Raise Over \$15,000.00

#### Musée Ukraina Museum Display at Saskatoon John G. Diefenbaker International Airport




Anyone departing from or meeting family or friends at the Saskatoon Airport this summer had the opportunity to check out the display featuring various Pysanky from the Victoria Buzinski collection. The Airport Authority was very pleased with the exhibit and has invited the Museum to prepare another display for 2009.

The display was made up of Pysanky (decorated eggs) from the Victoria Buzinski Collection which was donated to Musée Ukraina Museum. The Museum is very fortunate to be the protectors of such a fine collection. An open exhibition to the public was held on July 30, 2006 and Victoria was in attendance. Since the Museum's collections are now in storage awaiting a new home, the airport display was an excellent opportunity for us to share the collection with the public once more.

Victoria said that preserving her Ukrainian heritage has become a commitment that she shares with her family and her community. Her gift to the Museum is her way of inspiring and teaching the art of Pysanky writing - an ancient art form strongly connected to the Ukrainian heritage. ## Museum Receives Estate Bequest



The Museum recently received a cheque of \$5,000.00 from the estate of Mr. Nick Romanchuk (Mykola Romanczyk). Nick Romanchuk, a long time Museum supporter, passed away on Sunday December 16, 2007 at St. Paul's Hospital in Saskatoon.

Mr. Romanchuk was born August 21, 1921 in Perespa, Sokal district, Lviv, province of Western Ukraine. During the period of the Second World War, he, like many other Ukrainians, was forced to work as a laborer in Germany. Following the war he became a displaced person in a refugee camp. It was during this period that he became a student at the Ukrainian Peoples University in Munich, Germany. He eventually made his way to England where he was employed as an agricultural worker. Shortly after he made contact with his Uncle John Feschuk of Wakaw who would be his immigration sponsor which allowed Nick to come to Canada. Nick arrived in Halifax on January 17, 1949 and eventually made his way to the Sokal area around Wakaw. After a short stay in this area he became employed by the C.P.R. in Saskatoon. He eventually purchased farm land in the Langham area. Nick was a long standing member of St. George's Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in Saskatoon where he sang in the Choir. Nick supported many Ukrainian organizations in Canada and Ukraine, especially the League of Ukrainian Canadians.
