These men not only distinguished themselves in service to their country, but also to their families, their church and community. Their decision to serve was not to seek recognition; they only resolved to make the world a better place by doing their part. It is because of their sacrifices, heroism, and unselfish dedication, and of those many more who are no longer with us, that we need to be thankful for, and keep their stories alive.

Martin Hryniuk shares his experience in interviewing and visiting 18 of the 19 veterans: "I was honoured to not only hear about their experiences in service, but also about the relationships they formed with their fellow men. Each one spoke about comradeship and brotherhood developed in service, and how those who are no longer alive are remembered by them. These men spoke loving of their families, their community, and the strong faith that not only sustained them in service, but in life."

As William Kondra shared in his interview: "It was the faith and strong prayers of my Mother that kept me safe in service."

What is an Endowment Fund?

An endowment is an investment fund set aside for the long-term support of a charitable organization. The investment could be in the form of cash, stocks, shares, mutual funds, bonds or any other financial investment instrument. Only the interest income, declared dividends or declared capital gains may be used or could be re-invested to preserve and increase the principal amount. Only the income, or a portion of the income from such a fund, is made available to spend. The principal is preserved in perpetuity or another designated time. All funds are held in the organization's name. The invested money is protected, allowing it to grow. The principal is protected and only the income, or a portion of the income, is used to support operational costs or may be designated for other purposes.

The advantages of an endowment are many, and the rewards last forever. Endowments offer a solid base of funds that will be available now and in the future. They continue forever since only the interest earned is spent, allowing the fund to continue in perpetuity. Donors receive tax benefits in the form of charitable deductions. An endowment can allow the donor to honor or memorialize a loved one or a family as a permanent philanthropic legacy.

An endowment fund can be created for Musée Ukraina Museum with a minimum amount of \$5,000.00. If you are interested or require more information, please contact any of the Museum Board Members.

THE MASTERPIECE

Lorna Brodziak, Musée Ukraina Museum Board Member, is also a Board Member of the Preeceville and District Museum where she coordinated the construction of a traditional outdoor Ukrainian clay oven (piche). A group of very hard working and ambitious volunteers set out to build the oven "from scratch". They started with a cement base on which the wooden oven base was constructed. "U" shaped willows were held in place with a clay and hay mixture. 60 - 5 gallon pails of clay were used for the project. Lorna said they wanted to build the oven the way our ancestors would have done it. It is truly a master piece to behold. What a wonderful way to display their pride in their Ukrainian Heritage.


